
La dernière destination du Nautilus

O último destino do Nautilus: o porto da illa de Sálvora




O derradeiro destino do Nautilus

The last destination of the Nautilus: The Caribbean Islands


After 20 days, I'm free and also my partners on Captain Nemo's Nautilus. At last, I can have fresh air in my body.


While we have walked around the islands, we have seen other people, and my mates are very happy.




“THE LAST DESTINITY OF NAUTILUS”


